Parent/Teacher Consultations Monday 24th-Friday 28th October

Thank you for completing the recent parent teacher meeting questionnaire. The majority of parents requested a face to face meeting, so we are reverting to this method for all parents for our October meetings. To ensure the staff can get through the necessary interviews all P1-P7 children will be finishing at 1pm each day that week. Nursery pupils will be finishing at 11.30am, there will be no after school club that week.

This year we are trialling a new method of booking our parent/teacher interviews, via our school messaging service. You will **receive a message on Wednesday 5th October at 4.30pm**, asking you to select a suitable time with each teacher. This will work on a first come, first served basis, so please click on the message as soon as it is sent to have the best choice of dates and times.

Click on your chosen day and time slot and select your child's name from the dropdown menu and this will turn dark green with a tick, available slots will appear light green and slots already taken by other people will be red with an x. Quickly scroll on down to your next child and continue to choose a suitable interview time for each of your children. You do not have to hit any submit button, the choice you have selected will be noted and you will get a confirmation email message from noreplyorchardcountyps@school messages. Please keep this email so you can refer to your selected date and time with each teacher.

Please note that for classes where there is a job share, the interviews will usually be done by the class teacher working on the day selected. Meetings will last 10 mins.

For those parents who do not live together, please ensure that a suitable time is selected for both parents, as each teacher allocates only one slot per child.

The school bus will be available at 1pm every day that week for those children who normally travel home by bus.

Curriculum Booklets

Each teacher has posted their class curriculum booklet on their Google Classroom page. This sets out the curriculum (Numeracy, Literacy, WAU, ICT and homework guidance) for your child, for the year ahead. This is very useful and can be referred to throughout the year. If you have any questions about this, please speak to the class teacher during your parent/teacher interview.

Shared Education

Thank you for returning the Shared Education permission form. Classes will be starting their programme very soon, please see the dates for your diary. The details of each project will be posted on your child's Google Classroom page. Our focus this year for all class projects is outdoor learning. The children will be taking part in days at Orchard County PS, St Patrick's PS and will be going on class trips.

Maths Week



We have planned a **Maths week for 17th-21st October**. The teachers have planned very exciting maths tasks for this week and Mrs Allen, our Numeracy Co-ordinator has devised Maths Trails for the children to complete around the school. Talk to your child about what they are doing in class and encourage lots of Mathletics that week too. We are delighted with the enthusiasm for Mathletics.

Assessments & The Engage Programme

The staff have been assessing the pupils to identify the areas that they need more support with. We will be continuing with our Engage programme, providing additional support with literacy or numeracy. Your child's teacher will have notified you if your child will be receiving this additional support. Miss Wilson will be teaching these groups on Tuesdays.

Uniform

Please ensure that your child is wearing the correct PE uniform on PE days. As the weather gets cold, if wearing tracksuit bottoms, they should be <u>plain navy</u> and the school jumper or navy hoodie may be worn on colder days. Remember black shoes, not trainers should be worn with full school uniform.

Health

As we move into the colder weather we are expecting children to get the usual colds and viral infections. Please assess your children carefully, you know them best and know if they are fit for school. In many cases, children with colds will be well enough to attend school and continue their learning with little or no interruption to their education. We would just ask that you remind them of good respiratory hygiene. In other cases, for instance, where they have quite a heavy cold or a flu, they may need to take a day or two off to recover.

Please refer to the 'Guidance on Infection Control in Schools' for advice on whether your child needs to be kept at home following an illness or period of vomiting etc. this is a very useful poster to refer to. You will find it on the website- Parents' Area- letters.

Children should not attend school if they appear unwell or have been vomiting.

Covid

If a child tests positive for COVID-19, they should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 3 days. This starts from the day after they did the test. Children and young people tend to be infectious to others for less time than adults.



Communications

If you need to inform your child's teacher of anything, you may write it in your child's diary or send in a note. Alternatively, you may telephone the school office (8.30-3pm) or email Mrs McCluskey (jmccluskey773@c2kni.net), our school secretary, who will pass the message on to your child's teacher. Please remember staff should not be contacted through social media or via their personal phone numbers.

Absence Notification Slips

Please remember to complete an absence notification slip and return it to school on their first day back following a period of absence. These are available to download from the school website.

School Meals

ParentPay

Please ensure that your child knows whether they are taking a packed lunch or a dinner each day and what their menu choice is, Mrs Martin, our school cook plans according to the choices selected on ParentPay. Please check the menu (on the school website) carefully with your child to ensure that they like what is being served that day. Due to delayed deliveries, the catering supervisor may have to slightly change the planned menu, but changes are avoided if possible.

Nessy

Nessy is a reading and spelling software programme.

Each child in P2-4 should spend 80 minutes a week using this programme to improve their reading and spelling ability. Reading and spelling targets will be set for your child according to an independent assessment that they will complete in school before embarking on the programme.

Operation Encompass

A letter has been sent today to all parents informing you about our participation in Operation Encompass. This is an early intervention partnership between Police and Schools. It is aimed at supporting children who are victims of domestic violence.
